

# Short Cycle Pill Card Options

**Effective January 1, 2013** - LTC pharmacies must dispense to Skilled Nursing Home facilities with Medicare Part D residents, 14 day or less supplies of brand oral solid drugs only. Short filling 30 or 31 count pill cards is acceptable.

**Exclusions include** ointments, creams, liquids and any products that must be dispensed in the manufacturers original package. Assisted living facilities, ICF-MR, group homes and independent living are also excluded.

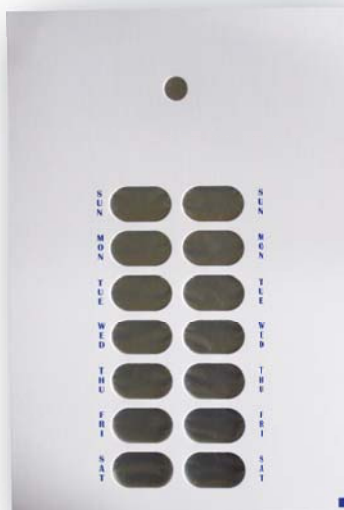
